Futurity Three Year Old Harness Championship

The Futurity driving trophy was started in 1997 after the success of The 4 year old Under Saddle Championship.

1997 Found One High-Time, a mare bred by Peter & Debbie Buick captured the first ever awarded trophy for the Three Year old driving Futurity class. She is a daughter of JMF Found One Beaman and out of Taproot Fairy Slipper.

In 1998 Chestnut Hill Tia bred by Kay Reeves was the winner. Tia is a daughter of Chestnut Hill Mr. T and out of the great carriage driving mare, Chestnut Hill Erica.

1999 saw Malloflax Maxxum bred by Tom Malloy take top honours, eventually becoming a nice western pleasure horse.

Beaming Hale Bopp won in the year 2000 for owner/breeder Helen Paine, a son of JMF Found One Beaman.

Chestnut Hill Royal-T was a pretty chestnut that won in 2002. He would eventually be sold to a young lady in Saskatchewan.

In 2003 A Victory Promise was another winner for owner/breeder Helen Paine in driving. He is a son of P.R.'s A Promise Kept.

2004 saw the bay mare Joland Remarkable Bay take the trophy home for Lisa Kavanagh-Ross. She is a daughter of The Corsican Bay and out of Saralin's Markessa.

Cyan Star Grand Marquis, a full sibling to Joland Remarkable Bay won in 2005 for Brian and Nancy Kavanagh. He would be sold to Christi Nye soon after.

2006 MLM Unbellevable was the winner for breeder/owner David & Connie Chisholm.

The gelding P.R.'s Immortal Pegasus bred by Paradise Ranch won in 2007, another son of P.R.'s A Promise Kept.

In 2008 Chestnut Hill Right On Q won for Chestnut Hill Morgans. She was later sold to a family in Manitoba.

2016 saw Baronial Blooming Star take the trophy home for owner Holly Buckley and breeder Baronial Morgans.

2021 DGH Sirius Business is our winner for owner/driver Ashley Reeson. Bred by Haywood Farm and out of their stallion Sirius Black.
